A Florida themed charm will be awarded for competing in the fifth interclub event.

The letters "F", "W", "S", and "A" will be repeated for competing in events six through nine.

A Florida themed charm will be awarded for competing in the 10th interclub event.

The letters "F", "W", "S", and "A" will be repeated for competing in events 11 through 14.

A Florida themed charm will be awarded for competing in the 15th interclub event.

The charm sequence mentioned above will be repeated for the 16th and beyond events.

Charms will also be awarded in the sequence above, to Salty Sisters who perform Race Committee and Safety Boat responsibilities when the interclub competitions are held at the SPYC.

Volunteer helpers for the Rainbow Regatta will be awarded a charm.

Each pin is a silver and enamel Salty Sisters Burgee on a silver bar, the Captain's surrounded by a gold rope and the Co-Captain's surrounded by a silver rope. Created by Barbara Watson. To be presented by each retiring Captain and Co-Captain to their successors at the Annual Meeting.

WEDNESDAY MORNING PARTICIPATION AWARD

2024

At the end of each sailing year, one week prior to the annual meeting, "Participation Charms" will be given out. The charm is based on the total accumulation of Wednesday mornings a Salty Sister has participated in Sailing, Race Committee, Education and/or any other activity that helps facilitate sailing. This could include activities such as repairing/organizing sails and boats or using a Wednesday morning to upkeep/organize the Salty Sister Locker.

This annual charm is awarded by the Co-Captain and the Awards Chairman. The Co-Captain is responsible for tracking the Wednesday morning participation and the Awards Chair is responsible for ordering the appropriate charms.

Three Charms will be based on three percentages; those Salty Sisters that participate 50-74% of Wednesday mornings, those Salty Sisters that participate 75-99% of Wednesday mornings and those Salty Sisters that participate 100% of Wednesday morning activities. The Charms given out will be a 50% charm, a 75% charm and a 100% charm.

SKIPPER'S HAT

1971

QUALIFICATIONS FOR SKIPPER'S HAT DESIGNATION

To be considered for testing a candidate must have demonstrated a sincere interest by sailing regularly with Salty Sisters in boats requiring crew, including Sonars, Ideal 18s and 420s. When the Skippers with whom she has been sailing believe that she is competent to skipper with novice crew and teach them to sail a candidate may be invited by the Skipper's Hat Committee to take the tests. The tests are usually completed in one to two seasons. There are four practical sailing tests:

- One in 420s;
- One in Sonars ;
- Two in Ideal 18s.

In addition, she must demonstrate a capsize drill in a 420, consisting of tipping and righting a fully rigged 420 with crew and without outside assistance.

She will sail a 420, a Sonar and an Ideal 18 in at least a 7-knot wind with different Skipper's Hats as crew. She will demonstrate her qualifications as both skipper and crew. This will include tacking, jibing, flying and jibing a spinnaker and takedown procedures. She will show her ability to instruct a novice crew in rigging, sailing (including with spinnaker) and derigging. She will demonstrate procedures for leaving the dock and returning safely to the dock and stowing all equipment.

A primary concern in both sailing and teaching is safety. She must demonstrate her qualifications to handle a boat and return to safe harbor in extreme weather if it should occur during racing. She will single-hand an Ideal 18 without a spinnaker and demonstrate a man overboard recovery.

She will pass an oral test that includes:

- Some information pertaining to the "Racing Rules of Sailing";
- All aspects of sailing pertaining to 420s, Sonars and Ideal 18s;
- Understanding routine sailing and various problems that can arise.

SKIPPER'S HAT COMMITTEE

1971

The Skipper's Hat Committee shall consist of all active Skipper's Hats who have sailed or participated in Salty Sisters Race Committee activities at least 8 days in the last 12 months prior to the committee meeting. The chair of the committee shall be elected from the committee membership and shall

be responsible for calling meetings. The committee shall meet at least once per year.

SKIPPER'S HAT CHALLENGE AND TOP-CREW TROPHY

2014

This trophy, donated by Barbara Watson, is a perpetual trophy consisting of a Swedish-crystal sailboat on top of a black-marble base. It will be awarded each year following a specific competition, with the winning Skipper's and winning Top Crew's names engraved on the base. In addition, the winning Skipper will receive a Celtic knot charm and the winning Top Crew will receive a smaller Celtic knot charm.

Each year a series will be sailed. Only those Salty Sisters who have been awarded their Skipper's Hat may race. The series will take place in a two-man boat, with a spinnaker, although skippers may opt not to use the spinnaker. Names will be drawn if necessary and all teams of two should be different each race day. Two races will be sailed each day, with each Salty skippering once and crewing once. All scores will be independent to each Salty, so for each race the skipper receives her points and the crew hers, according to the finish. Some discretion may be allowed to the Race Chair to achieve the completion of this competition. Three days of two races each will constitute a regatta, although five would be better. If more than two races are sailed on one day, the Skipper and/or Crew will receive their average points for the day.

HONG KONG TROPHY

1965

This trophy, donated by PC Erni Mittermayr, is a glass enclosed sterling silver Chinese junk mounted on a rosewood base. This trophy is a perpetual trophy presented to a Salty Sister who achieves five consecutive firsts in a regular (not a trophy) series. To be eligible she must have completed three series of sailing with the Salty Sisters. The name of the skipper and the crew, if any, as well as the year, shall be engraved on the base plate. The trophy shall, at all times, remain on display at the SPYC. A Skipper may win this trophy only once in each class of boats sailed by the Salty Sisters. Winning skippers and crew shall be awarded first-place charms and silver Chinese junk keeper charms chosen at the discretion of the Awards Officer.

1958

This trophy, donated by Maggie McClure, is a silver bowl mounted on a wooden base. It is a perpetual trophy presented to the winning skipper of this series and engraved with her name and the winning year. This series shall be sailed in a one-design class boat, preferably in the bay. Crew, once assigned, shall remain with the same skipper for the duration of the series. In case of illness, the skipper shall endeavor to find a suitable substitute approved by the Race Committee. Should a skipper win three times, she shall then retire from racing for the Maggie Mug. Crew members shall be eligible for the crew charm with any winning skipper. A keeper charm (mug) shall be presented to the winner of this trophy. Keeper charms (crowns) shall be awarded to the winning crew.

CHILE TROPHY

1955

This trophy is a sailboat with a horn-shaped hull containing a Swiss music box presented to the Salty Sisters by Chile Land, a Yacht Club bartender in 1955. It is a perpetual trophy and shall remain at all times on display at the St. Petersburg Yacht Club. It shall be awarded to the winner of a series of pram races for the more experienced sailors who have previously won the Misfit Trophy.

The series shall be sailed as near October as possible. 720s shall be in effect. A minimum of five races is required. A keeper charm (cocktail glass) shall be awarded to the winner of this trophy. Should one member win three times, she shall then retire from racing for the Chile Trophy.

Names of members who win once or twice shall be engraved on a plate at the base of the trophy. Should one member win three times her plate shall be moved to the top of the base. Second- and third-place charms may be awarded.

The bracelet has been mounted on velvet and framed. This trophy shall, at all times, remain on display at the St. Petersburg Yacht Club. It shall be awarded to the winner of a series of pram races for the inexperienced sailors only. The series shall be sailed once a year. 720s will be in effect. A minimum of five races is required. A keeper charm, a ring with a sailboat in it, shall be awarded to the winner of this trophy. The Jobin may be sailed only once by any individual. Second- and third-place charms may be awarded.

A keeper charm (rocking chair) is awarded to the winner of this trophy, which may only be won once. 720s will be in effect.

Any Salty Sister, who is a grandmother, by any means other than genetically, is eligible. It is a perpetual trophy and shall remain on display at the St. Petersburg Yacht Club at all times. The one race shall be sailed on the closest Wednesday after Mothers' Day. There must be a minimum of three boats to constitute a regatta. The Salty Sister Sailing Instructions will be in effect. A keeper charm (Special Grandma) will be awarded to the winner of this trophy, which may be won once.

The race shall be sailed on the Wednesday closest to Mother's Day, in conjunction with the Grandmother's and Other Grandmother's Races. The current Salty Sister Sailing Instructions will be in effect. This will be one race, sailed in a pram or a keelboat, where the skipper must be the Notta Momma.

A keeper charm (Mermaid) will be awarded to the winner of the race. A Salty can win this race only once.

A Salty who has won may race again if there is a spare pram. If there are more past winners than spare prams, then they will draw for a pram. 720s will be in effect. Second and third place charms may be awarded.
