

THE FOLLOWING TROPHIES HAVE BEEN RETIRED OR ARE INACTIVE

QUINCY TUCKER MEMORIAL TROPHY

1974-1992

This trophy, a large silver covered Revere bowl on a wooden base and topped with a sailboat, was given by Mrs. Frederick. E. Howe in memory of her father, Quincy Tucker, who was a dear friend of the Salty Sisters. It is a perpetual trophy presented each year to the member winning a special pram race that was sailed the Wednesday closest to July 4th, Quincy's birth date.

The course consisted of at least five legs. The participating Salty Sisters were those who had accumulated the most racing charms as of the end of the immediately preceding series. In the case of a tie in charms, the member with the most seniority in membership sailed.

To be eligible to compete in this series, the member had to have sailed in at least two series from July to July during the past twelve months. This trophy could be won only once by a Salty Sister. A keeper charm (old sailing ship) was awarded to the winner and her name was engraved on the perpetual trophy. This race did not count toward the High Point Trophy award. It was extended by Adele Caldwell and we raced through 1992.

SANDY WIDENER WESCOTT MEMORIAL

This trophy, donated by Sandy's husband, George Wescott, is a sterling silver miniature champagne bucket with her Salty Sisters bracelet attached and mounted on a wooden base. The Salty Sisters with the most charms who had never won the Chile Trophy were eligible to race one flight in prams. To be eligible to compete in this series, the member must have sailed in at least two series May to May during the past twelve months. The trophy could only be won once. The keeper charm was a roulette wheel. The race was sailed for five years. Mary Simmons extended it for an additional five years. The keeper was then a hand of cards.

TAKEOVER MEMORIAL TROPHY

1973-1994

This trophy, donated by P/C Ardith Rutland and P/C Dorothy Rhodes, is a silver tray engraved with the fouled anchor emblem of the Salty Sisters. This trophy is a perpetual trophy presented each year to the member who has earned the most points (one point each race) as a substitute in races which she consented to enter when a regularly scheduled member has been unable to race. The tray serves as a memorial trophy to remember all deceased Salty Sisters. The tray is engraved each year with the name of the winner and the year. A keeper charm (starfish) is awarded to the winner.

This trophy, a silver cigarette box, is inscribed with the winner's name and is a perpetual award. It is awarded annually to the person having the most accumulated points earned in all eligible series throughout the year and is open to all sailing groups. Scoring for high point award:

3 points for 1st in series
2 points for 2nd in series
1 point for 3rd in series

A keeper charm (star engraved with the year won) is awarded to the winner.

DARLENE CLARK BIKINI CUP

1987-2009

Originally established as the St. Petersburg Yacht Club Bikini Cup and then renamed the Women's Challenge, this event is now sailed in memory of Darlene Clark, a Salty Sister who was very active in both sailing and race management and who died in 1995.

The Salty Sister perpetual trophies: the **Salty Sister Bikini Trophy/Spinnaker** and the **Salty Sister Bikini Trophy/Non-Spinnaker** (described as two wooden plaques, each with a fleet of eight brass sailboats against a copper sun) will be awarded to the Salty Sister skippers whose boats place highest in these divisions. In addition to the skipper's name, the names of any Salty Sister crewing for the winning skipper are engraved on the trophies. The keeper charm awarded to Salty Sisters skippers and crewmembers is a letter "D."

In addition, two SPYC perpetual trophies are awarded to any competitor entered in this event: 1) the **SPYC Bikini Series Trophy/Racing Division** (a large brass brandy snifter on a wooden pedestal) for first place in the Spinnaker division; and 2) the **SPYC Bikini Regatta/ Competition Sails Trophy** aka the "*The Tony Johnson Bikini Trophy*" (described as a large brass bikini mounted on a wooden plaque) for first place in the non-spinnaker division.

The **Darlene Clark Challenge "Spirit of Competition" trophy** (described as a huge white marble-based trophy topped with a blue globe of the world) will be awarded by ballot vote of competitors to any sailor, race committee or participant in this event who perpetuates the SPIRIT OF COMPETITION by displaying one or all of the following criteria:

- Showing perseverance and exceptional effort to develop sailing skills.
- Exhibiting good support for women's racing and/or on-the-water events.
- Achieving or attempting personal goals through exceptional character.
- Showing special camaraderie, spirit, respect and/or assistance to other sailors.
- Active participation and good performance in race management.

FRIENDSHIP REGATTA

2009-2017

This trophy, donated by Rick and Peggy Lonnon, is a round brass disk with a cut out of a pram on top. It is known as the “Salty Sisters/Broad Reachers Interclub Perpetual Trophy”, and will be presented to the winner of the regatta and engraved with her name and winning year. This trophy is to be awarded to the individual winner of the annual sailboat (pram) regatta held between the Salty Sisters and the Broad Reachers only. The clubs will alternate years hosting the regatta. Three races will be scheduled. One race will constitute a Regatta. There shall be one winner. Should an individual win three times, she shall retire from racing for the Friendship Trophy.

The trophy shall be presented each year to the new winner of the regatta and shall be held in safekeeping and displayed by her club until the next year’s annual event. A keeper charm engraved “Special Person” shall be awarded.

The trophy is made with pieces of Jeannine’s jewelry that were given to Char by Jeannine’s family. Bruce Watters, who passed away in mid-2016, designed the trophy, which will be awarded to a Green Fleet member sailing in her first regatta. Also awarded at the regatta will be one silver and one gold pin.

ALLISON JOLLY/AGNES ROY TROPHIES

1990

The Allison Jolly and Agnes Roy Trophies are perpetual trophies donated by the Salty Sisters to support and promote camaraderie and competition for junior girl sailors.

Allison Jolly is the first woman to win a gold medal in sailing in the Olympic Games in 1988 and a graduate of the St. Petersburg Yacht Club Junior Sailing Program. The trophy, made by Briny Brother Nick Stan, is a brass International Optimist Dinghy (I.O.D.) with a hiking girl and dolphin leaping off the bow. The trophy has a brass plate naming the winner and the year it is awarded to the best finishing I.O.D. sailor between the ages of 8 and 15.

Agnes Roy was a Salty Sister who was also a nurse, teacher, bridge player and sailor. Agnes was competitive in Optimist Prams well into her 80s. The Agnes Roy Trophy is a perpetual trophy made by Briny Brother Dave Shreve from the wooden centerboard of an Optimist. It displays Agnes Roy's Salty Sister charm bracelet. This trophy is awarded to the best finishing sailor and crew in the 420 class. The Allison Jolly trophy was originally presented in 1990 to the top girl sailor in the annual International Valentines Day Optimist Regatta. In 2000, the Salty Sisters established the Allison Jolly Optimist Regatta, and the trophy was rededicated. In 2005, the regatta was renamed the Florida State Girls Championship. In 2006, the regatta was expanded to include Laser Radial and Laser 4.7 fleets, along with the Optimist and 420 fleets.

Over the years, due to an increasing competition in scheduled OPTI regattas, it became more difficult for the Salty Sisters to organize a successful event. In 2018, the Allison Jolly Committee approached the Valentine's Day Optimist Regatta Committee to explore the idea of collaborating and awarding the Allison Jolly trophy to the best overall girl finisher. The successful collaboration continued for the 2019 and 2020 Valentine's Day Optimist regattas. In 2019 and 2020, the trophy award was extended to include the best girl finisher in the Gold Fleet and to the best girl finisher in the Silver Fleet.
